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Your application for federal student aid was selected for a review process called “**verification**”. 2. **Do not leave any item blank. If the answer is “0”, put “0.” *Incomplete Worksheets will be returned for completion.***
3. Submit a complete and signed copy of your 2009 federal tax returns and your parent’s or spouse’s signed 2009 returns if requested. **A complete copy includes every page of the return: all schedules, attachments, and W-2s.**
