Where do you go when you need math or English help?

Some students ask their friends, some look online, and some go to the experts at the Lanier Tech Student Success Center (SSC). There is a Student Success Center located at the Barrow Campus, Dawson Campus, Forsyth Campus, and the Hall Campus. They each have tutoring times designed to accommodate students' schedules.

Students come to the SSC to not only get help from the tutors, but also to meet with other students and form study groups. There are three private study rooms at the Hall campus intended for just this purpose. The study rooms can also be used if you prefer to study in a quiet environment. If not reserved, the rooms will be on a first come, first serve basis. There are also 24 computers available in the SSC at the Hall Campus and 9 computers available in the SSC at the Forsyth campus.

The math tutors at each campus have received training in how to best help students with their questions, and they are knowledgeable in what they are tutoring. They are there not only to explain math problems but to encourage and support students. Many of the tutors meet students for the first time in their MATH 0090A or MATH 0090Q classes. Students will begin working with a tutor in a learning support class and then continue working with the same tutor when they are taking a degree level math class. This connection proves to have positive results.

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### **TEAMS**

Starting college is a big step and one that can be challenging for every student, whether they are coming directly out of high school or coming back to continue their education later in life. The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) has created a program to help meet the needs of our students and support them throughout their program of study: TCSG Early

Alert Management System (TEAMS).

TEAMS is an early alert tool that is used by our instructors to ensure that students who are struggling in the classroom get the extra help, guidance, and support they need in order to be successful. If an instructor sees a student in need of extra support, the instructor will submit the student to TEAMS. The student will be automatically routed to the appropriate Lanier Technical College Student Services staff member, who will then reach out to that student, usually by email or telephone, and assist in any way they are able. Being submitted into TEAMS is not a negative thing in any way. It is our way, as teachers and staff at Lanier Tech, to best serve and support our students as they make their way through the challenges of college. We are here for you!
