Footnotes:

1. All Biology courses must have been completed within five calendar years of the ASN application submission deadline.
2. The **ATI-TEAS for Allied Health Exam** may be taken no more than two times in a calendar year with 30 days between each test attempt. No TEAS test can be greater than five years old at the ASN application submission deadline.
3. **Allied Health-related degrees examples** are professions that are distinct from medicine and nursing; these include (but are not limited to): dental hygienists, sonographers, dietitians, medical technologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, radiographers, respiratory therapists, speech language pathologists, audiologists, genetic assistant, health information technologists, health information management, clinical laboratory tech, etc. Please submit the official transcript to LTC that reflects degree conferment for evaluation.

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4. **Paramedicine:** Paramedic applicant must have attended a state-approved and accredited Paramedicine program, completed a clinical practicum, and passed the NREMT Certification Examination.
EMT-I/AEMT: EMT-I/AEMT applicant must have attended a state-approved and accredited Paramedicine program, completed a clinical practicum, and passed the NREMT Certification Examination.
Medical Assistant: CMA/RMA applicant must have attended a CAAHEP or ABHES accredited program, completed a clinical practicum, and passed the CMA (AAMA) Certification exam.
Nursing Assistant: CNA applicant must have attended a state-approved CNA program, completed a clinical practicum, and passed the NNAAP Certification Exam or the state CNA examination equivalency. Applicant's licensure/certification information must appear in the states' registry.
 5. **The maximum number of points per category will be awarded**, if applicant is qualified; points may not be combined within individual categories, if the applicant should hold multiple licenses and/or certifications.
 6. **Please note: Hall and Forsyth cohort start dates vary and students cannot switch cohorts once admitted to a specific location.**
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
