



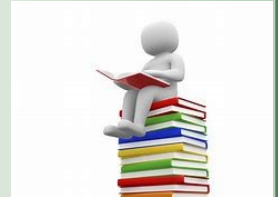
These last few months....

Changes to Learning Support Math



What if.....

...you are enrolled in a diploma program at Lanier Tech and need to complete MATH 1012 for your math requirement. Your advisor has told you that you need to enroll in a math support class.

If so, you will enroll in MATH 0912A and MATH 1012A simultaneously. What is different is MATH 0912A is 3 instructional hours (as opposed to 1 instructional hour like in MATH 0090A). These additional 2 hours per week of math instructions will provide you with the background skills that will match up with objectives in the diploma level MATH 1012A class. It will give you time to practice the material from MATH 1012A and receive help from an instructor and in-class tutor, when possible. This new class will be available beginning the fall 2020 semester. MATH 0090A is no longer offered.

...you are enrolled in a degree program at Lanier Tech and need to complete MATH 1111 for your math requirement. Your advisor has told you that you need to enroll in a math support class.

Learning Support Classes MATH 0090B/0090Q and MATH 0090C are no longer offered. Instead, if you require a math support class, you will enroll in MATH 0911B AND in MATH 1111B simultaneously. MATH 0911B is three instructional hours and will provide you with the background skills that will match up with objectives in the degree level MATH 1111B class. It will offer time in class to practice the material from MATH 1111B and receive help from an instructor and in-class tutor, when possible. Study skills and collaborative group work will be included as it was in MATH 0090Q, and exploratory activities will be part of the class where appropriate. Best of all, you will have the opportunity to complete one degree level math class with learning support in one semester! These new classes will be offered beginning the summer 2020 semester.
