Special Population students include individuals with disabilities; individuals from economically disadvantaged families, including low-income youth and adults; individuals preparing for non-traditional fields; single parents, including single pregnant women; out-of-workforce individuals; English learners; homeless individuals: youth who are in, or have aged out of, the foster care system; and youth with a parent who are in the military.

Highlighted Resources for the month: Cosmetology, Esthetics, Dental Hygiene, and Horticulture

On my last newsletter a student said that they would like to know more about the services that our college offers from our programs here. I thought that was a great idea so it is impossible in this newsletter to quote all the rates (which could change at any time so make sure you check with that department). In a small snapshot here are the following programs that offer services:

- 1) Dental Hygiene oral exams, radiographs, prophylaxis, fluoride varnish, nutritional counseling, non-surgical periodontal therapy, fabrication for whitening trays, and more. (Hall Campus only)
- 2) Cosmetology Nail care, haircuts, foiling, permanent waving, facials, microdermabrasion, and hair renewal treatments to name a few. (Hall and Dawson Campus)
- 3) Esthetics Spa services such as skincare treatment, hair renewal treatments, special event makeup services, and spray tanning, and so much more. (Hall Campus)
- 4) Horticulture Our horticulture department sells plants and flowers during the spring season at great deals. I have bought a lot of my plants there. They sell herbs, tomato plants, pepper plants, flowers and groundcovers. (Forsyth Campus)
