









New Single Sign-On for WCONLINE

The Student Success Center WCONLINE website is now accessible through the Laker Login Portal. To reach WCONLINE, students will now log in to their Laker Login Portal and select the red WCONLINE tile. Along with this new update, all WCONLINE accounts are now directly linked to the student's Lanier Technical College email address and password. When registering for a new WCONLINE account, students will be asked to verify their student ID number. At this time, students will also have the option to add their phone number to receive text message updates regarding their tutoring appointments.


Student Success Center Report Fall and Spring 2023

- For all math students, attending tutoring improved their math GPA by an average of 0.5 points or half a letter grade.
- The number of students passing their math class increased by 30 percent when students attended tutoring for one hour per week.
- The number of students withdrawing from their math class decreased by 18 percent when students attended tutoring for one hour per week.
- 100% of diploma-level math students that attended tutoring once a week passed their math class.
- For degree-level math students, attending tutoring improved their math GPA by an average of 0.55 points.

Students who attended Fall Boot Camp increased their basic algebra skills by 127%.



Anatomy is one of the most important subjects in medical and nursing education. It is the study of structure, framing, and the relationship between body parts. All doctors, nurses, and physicians must study anatomy to work in healthcare. The study of anatomy is also essential for figurative artists. Frank Frazetta, an American artist, used his study of human anatomy in comic books, book covers, paintings, posters, LP record album covers, and other media. To develop a firm grasp of human anatomy, he copied *Constructive Anatomy* by George Bridgman in his early years. Frazetta's 1976 painting, *Dark Kingdom*, shows his knowledge of detailed musculature. This painting sold for \$6 million in 2023.

Models of the skeleton, muscular system, brain, and structures of the internal organs provide a great tool for detailed study. 
